What to Expect

A licensed, staged musical supervised by WVYT's Artistic Director.

Up to 8 hours of rehearsals per week, tech week, and up to 6 performances.

Vocal director, choreographer, video and audio professionals, and production managers.



Assistance in coordinating parent volunteering, ticketing, set construction, and costuming.

An emotionally supportive environment designed to introduce kids of all abilities to the theater arts.





As a not-for-profit, our primary objective is to get quality arts education to as many students as possible. For this reason, our cost structure is transparent, economical, and tailored to your school's vision. Our fees are broken up into two categories.

Reimbursement of our Estimated Expenses

Our estimated expenses are determined based on each school's needs and wants in a production. We'll be able to work with you to define your objectives and lay out the specific expenses necessary to make your vision a reality.

A Portion of Ticket Sales

To help cover our administrative expenses we ask to share in any ticket sales your production generates (typically 50%) with a defined minimum (typically \$750 / show).





Theater arts are not just about performing on stage. We are working with the Youth Theater Alliance to develop technical training for kids in computer graphics, lighting and audio design, set construction, and production management. These camps are designed to open performance arts to an entirely new group of kids who can apply these skills to our own productions providing a true dress rehearsal for potential professional careers.
